CHANGES TO STATUTE


- 2015 Youth ages 14 and older who have committed a felony offense or are seriously mentally ill can be committed to ADJC.
- 2018 Extended Jurisdiction Youth can now be committed to our agency until age 19 subject to certain limitations and if the prosecutor chooses to extend the juvenile court's jurisdiction.

Fiscal Year 2015






